Saiful, a Muslim young man was one of our construction worker. Like any other worker, he was also



working under a supervisor. During one of the holidays he went home and did not return to work. Initially, we didn't pay attention. But later, he called our caretaker to tell us that he has become a Christian and for which his family and co-workers disdain him and even refused to let him work. After trying to stick around with some people and not getting the support he needed, he realized that the only place he will be accepted and embraced was the Miglat Ministry. So he came back to us. We sure did receive him wholeheartedly but we also knew this was not enough. He has a very curious heart and mind to read and learn the Word of God. With no formal schooling, this is not easy for him. He became a part of the Miglat Family and we loved him and he loved us. But we were also praying that God will open ways for him to grow, learn and be nurtured by people who are from similar backgrounds. God did open ways. He was able to do a week training with other Muslim converts and get connected with people reaching out to the Muslim community. Very soon (hopefully after the

lockdown and situation comes to normal) he will be going to a farm to stay with a former Muslim Mullah who will mentor and nurture him in his journey of faith .in God. Walk along with him through prayers as he continue his journey of knowing God. Saiful also help us understand what it really means to be "Salt and Light" as Christians. He said we were different and we call him by name and respected and loved him. Sure we are called to be the walking Kingdom of God.
